Come visit the Wishard Nursing Museum, located in what was once the School of Nursing's residence hall. The museum traces the origins of Wishard Hospital back to 1855, when it was first used as a civil war hospital, and 1883 as the first school of nursing in the city of Indianapolis. You will even get to see where the filming of hospital scenes took place from the 1986 classic movie, *Hoosiers*, with Dennis Hopper.

The historic Madame C.J. Walker Building, named after America's first self-made female millionaire is home to the Madame Walker Theatre Center, a non-profit cultural institution that celebrates the arts from an African American perspective. Plan to visit the 82 year-old theatre and museum at 1:00 pm sharp and be amazed by the wonderful stories told by the resident theatre company Freetown Village, as well as a guided building and museum tour.

10. National Art Museum of Sport at University Place – IUPUI

Tour of the Times participants will be offered a free 24-page gallery guide, 15-minute video opportunity, option of a free guided-tour. The National Art Museum of Sport, located in the public areas of the conference center wing of University Place Conference Center and Hotel on the IUPUI campus, is the nation's premier collection of art depicting sport. It contains over 900 paintings, sculptures and works on paper represent 40 sports. Currently the exhibit of about 200 pieces from the permanent collection includes "landmarks" in the Museum's 50-year history and the newest additions to the collection: a portrait of swimmer Michael Phelps, and 24 paintings of NBA stars.
